LWVI continues to honor Keller's challenge to the Lions Clubs by advancing surgical techniques and developing services to support surgeons and help them adapt new and more effective procedures. LWVI has since become the largest non-profit distributor of ocular tissue worldwide with East and West Coast operations.
